The Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure met at 10:00 a.m. on March 2, 2022, in 2167 Rayburn House Office Building and virtually via Zoom, pursuant to notice, in an open session, with a quorum present, and considered the following measures:

H.R. 6865, To authorize appropriations for the Coast Guard, and for other purposes.

H. Con. Res. 74, Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the National Peace Officers Memorial Service and the National Honor Guard and Pipe Band Exhibition.

The Committee took the following actions:

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**H.R. 6865**, To authorize appropriations for the Coast Guard, and for other purposes. Was ordered to be favorably reported to the House of Representatives, amended, by a voice vote.

The Chair discharged the Subcommittee on Coast Guard and Maritime Transportation from further consideration of H.R. 6865.

An amendment offered by Mr. Perry (#5); At the end of subtitle A of title III, add Sec. \_\_\_\_\_. "Exemption from Coastwise Laws for Vessels Transporting Liquefied Natural Gas"; was NOT AGREED TO by voice vote.

An amendment offered by Mr. Graves of Louisiana (#6); At the end of title IV, add Sec. \_\_\_\_.  
 “Manning and Crewing Requirements for Certain Vessels, Vehicles, and Structures”;  
 was AGREED TO by a record vote of 59 yeas and 2 nays (Roll Call Vote No. 86).

An amendment offered by Mr. Perry (#7); At the end of title IV, add Sec. \_\_\_\_\_. “Prohibition on Use of Funds for Electric Vehicles and Infrastructure”; was NOT AGREED TO by voice vote.

An amendment offered by Mr. Graves of Louisiana (#8); At the end of subtitle B of title III, add Sec. \_\_\_\_\_. “Risk-Based Inspections”; was WITHDRAWN

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**H. Con. Res. 74**, Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the National Peace Officers Memorial Service and the National Honor Guard and Pipe Band Exhibition. Was ordered to be favorably reported to the House of Representatives, without amendment, by voice vote.

The Chair discharged the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings, and Emergency Management from further consideration of H. Con. Res. 74.

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A unanimous consent request by Mr. DeFazio that H.R. 6865 and H. Con. Res. 74 will be reported as a single Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute incorporating any amendments adopted, was NOT OBJECTED TO.

A unanimous consent request by Mr. DeFazio that staff be authorized to make all necessary technical, clarifying and conforming changes to H.R. 6865, and H. Con. Res. 74; was NOT OBJECTED TO.

A motion by Mr. DeFazio that, pursuant to Rule XXII, clause 1, the Committee authorizes the Chair, or designee, to offer such motions as may be necessary in the House to go to conference with the Senate on H.R. 6865 and H. Con. Res. 74, or any similar measure, was NOT OBJECTED TO.

Pursuant to Rule XI clause 2(l), of the Rules of the House of Representative, the Chair notes that Members may have two calendar days in which to file any supplemental, minority, additional, or dissenting views on H.R. 6865, or H. Con. Res. 74.

A unanimous consent request by Mr. DeFazio that, the Chair, after consultation with the Ranking Member, has authority to strike or revise any provision of the bills ordered reported today that would cause a sequential referral to another committee, or that would cause the bills to concurrent resolutions to be subject to a Budget Act of Rule 21 PAYGO point of order, was NOT OBJECTED TO.
