1 (d) Feasibility of In-Cabin Wheelchair Re-2 STRAINT SYSTEMS.— 3 (1) ROADMAP.—Not later than 1 year after the 4 date of enactment of this section, the Secretary shall 5 submit to the appropriate committees of Congress a 6 publicly available strategic roadmap that describes 7 how the Department of Transportation and the United States Access Board, respectively, shall, in 8 9 accordance with the recommendations from the Na-10 tional Academies of Science, Engineering, and Math-11 ematics Transportation Research Board Special Re-12 port 341— 13 (A) establish a program of research, in col-14 laboration with the Rehabilitation Engineering 15 and Assistive Technology Society of North 16 America (RESNA), the assistive technology in-17 dustry, air carriers, original equipment manu-18 facturers, national disability and disabled vet-

1	erans organizations, and any other relevant
2	stakeholders, to test and evaluate an appro-
3	priate selection of WC19-compliant wheelchairs
4	and accessories in accordance with applicable
5	FAA crashworthiness and safety performance

8	(B) sponsor studies that assess issues and
9	considerations, including those set forth in Spe-

11	(i) the likely demand for air travel by

13	individuals could remain seated in their
14	personal wheelchairs in flight; and
15	(ii) the feasibility of implementing
16	seating arrangements that would accommo-
17	date passengers in wheelchairs in the main
18	cabin in flight.
19	(2) Study.—If determined to be technically
20	feasible by the Secretary, not later than 2 years
21	after making such determination, the Secretary shall
22	commence a study to assess the economic and finan-
23	cial feasibility of air carriers and foreign air carriers
24	implementing seating arrangements that accommo-
25	date passengers with wheelchairs (including power

1	wheelchairs, manual wheelchairs, and scooters) in
2	the main cabin during flight. Such study shall in-
3	clude an assessment of—
4	(A) the cost of such seating arrangements,

12	ments on the cost of operations and airfare;

15	propriate by the Secretary.
16	(3) Report.—Not later than 1 year after the
17	date on which the study under paragraph (2) is
18	completed, the Secretary shall submit to the appro-
19	priate committees of Congress a publicly available
20	report describing the results of the study conducted
21	under paragraph (2), together with any rec-
22	ommendations the Secretary determines appropriate.
