Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

2	This Act may be cited as the "Water Resources Tech-

6	(a) In General.—Not later than 1 year after the
7	date of enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General
8	of the United States shall initiate a comprehensive review
9	of all covered technical assistance.
10	(b) REQUIREMENTS.—The Comptroller General shall
11	include in the review required under subsection (a) the fol-
12	lowing:
13	(1) A description of all covered technical assist-
14	ance available to States, Tribes, local governments,
15	and non-governmental organizations, including—
16	(A) the regions and populations that are
17	served through the provision of technical assist-
18	ance; and

1	(B) a summary of the activities and ac-
2	tions carried out through covered technical as-
3	sistance during the 5-year period preceding this
4	Act.
5	(2) A comprehensive review of how the Admin-
6	istrator of the Environmental Protection Agency,
7	through the Water Technical Assistance initiative
8	(known as "WaterTA initiative"), identifies, selects,
9	and partners with technical assistance providers to
10	support communities, including—
11	(A) a description of the criteria, evaluation
12	process, and contracting mechanisms used for
13	selecting such providers;
14	(B) a description of the extent of coordina-
15	tion with State, Tribal, and regional partners in
16	the selection and deployment of such providers;
17	(C) a description of how such providers are
18	matched to meet the needs of local commu-
19	nities, including any pre-engagement scoping
20	activities or community consultations;
21	(D) a description of how such providers
22	identify communities in need of technical assist-
23	ance, including economically distressed commu-
24	nities, and conduct outreach to such commu-
25	nities;

1	(E) a description of the scope and types of
2	assistance delivered through such initiative; and
3	(F) a list of communities that received
4	technical assistance support through such ini-
5	tiative, including the type and cost of assistance
6	received by each such community and a sum-
7	mary of the outcomes associated with the provi-
8	sion of such assistance.
9	(3) An analysis of any duplication of covered
10	technical assistance available through multiple pro-
11	grams of the Environmental Protection Agency.
12	(4) An evaluation of how the provision of cov-
13	ered technical assistance builds capacity in commu-
14	nities to access other water infrastructure programs
15	carried out by the Administrator.
16	(5) An assessment of the needs of economically
17	distressed communities eligible to receive assistance
18	under a clean water infrastructure program carried
19	out by the Administrator that are not addressed
20	through covered technical assistance.
21	(6) An evaluation of how the Administrator car-
22	ries out covered technical assistance in coordination
23	with other Federal agencies providing technical as-
24	sistance related to water infrastructure.

1	(7) An evaluation of how covered technical as-
2	sistance supports communities in understanding,
3	identifying, and implementing alternative and cost-
4	effective technologies and features of treatment
5	works that achieve long-term savings and improved
