In addition to the Levee Association, Tom was elected to and serves as President on three local Levee and Drainage District Boards, which combined, represent over 21,000 acres of Missouri River bottomland. He has presented testimony before the United States Congress on topics relating to Endangered Species, Missouri River Operations, Federal Crop Insurance and the Federal Estate Tax. Tom was named the 2011 Agricultural Leader of the Year by the Agricultural Leaders of Tomorrow (A LOT) Organization. In 2013, the Agricultural Business Council of Kansas City presented Tom with the Jay B. Dillingham Agricultural Leadership and Excellence Award. He also serves as a Trustee of the Orrick Christian Church. He has been a member of several agricultural advisory boards and committees for various elected officials, including, US Senators, US Representatives and various State elected officials. He is also a member of the Farm Bureau, National Corn Growers Association, American Soybean Association and the Agricultural Business Council of Kansas City.
