


## MARK REIS



Mark Reis is the managing director of Seattle-Tacoma International Airport (Sea-Tac), the 14th busiest passenger airport in the U.S., providing service to over 34 million passengers in 2013.

He was the deputy managing director of Sea-Tac Airport from 2000 to 2004. Prior to that, he was the general manager of commercial development at Sea-Tac and director of finance for the Port of Seattle as a whole. He has worked for the Port since 1988.

Reis currently serves as Chair of Airports Council International – North America and is on the Executive Committee and Board of Directors of Airports Council International, the world-wide association of airports. He also serves as Chair of the Advisory Committee of Huxley College of the Environment of Western Washington University.

Mark earned a Master of Public Administration degree from the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University and a Bachelor's degree in environmental studies from Western Washington University.
