



Faye Malarkey Black is President and CEO of the Regional Airline Association (RAA), representing U.S. regional airlines and a broad network of associate members who engage with the industry through RAA. RAA members operate one-third of all U.S. passenger flights and provide the only scheduled air service to two-thirds of the nation's commercially served airports—driving more than \$152 billion in annual economic activity, supporting one million jobs nationwide, along with \$41 billion in wages.

Since 2015, Faye has led the transformation of the Association—strengthening its culture, finances, and national policy impact—while advancing aviation safety, workforce development, and access to air service for small and mid-sized communities. In 2019, she launched RAA's 501(c)(3) scholarship foundation, which has since awarded dozens of scholarships to aspiring aviation professionals.

Earlier in her career, Faye helped associations build government affairs programs and worked with businesses and nonprofits in emerging democracies as a USAID subcontractor, strengthening institutional capacity and policy engagement. She also served in the office of U.S. Senator Harris Wofford and worked on political campaigns as a speechwriter and field organizer.

She serves as a Trustee of the Aviation Accreditation Board International and was appointed to the U.S. Department of Transportation's congressionally mandated Small Community Air Service Working Group. She holds a B.A. from the University of Pittsburgh.
