Heather MacLeod is a Director in the Homeland Security and Justice team for the U.S. Government Accountability Office (GAO)—a nonpartisan and independent investigative arm of the U.S. Congress. Ms. MacLeod joined GAO in 2002. During the last 20 years, Ms. MacLeod has worked on a range of public policy issues at GAO. She currently leads the agency's oversight work on Coast Guard and maritime security issues such as Coast Guard workforce and strategic planning efforts, and maritime port and supply chain/cargo security.
