



**Jocelyn Fenton, Director of Programs
Denali Commission**

Jocelyn Fenton serves as the Director of Programs for the Denali Commission, an independent federal agency dedicated to infrastructure improvements and workforce development that support Alaska's economic growth. Ms. Fenton oversees a wide array of Commission programs statewide, including energy, transportation, water and sanitation, health facilities, housing, workforce development, communications, and transfer accounts. She held the position of Interim Federal Co-Chair for nine months in 2025, leading the Commission through its transition between Federal Co-Chairs.

Before joining the Commission, Ms. Fenton worked in upstream and downstream resource development, where she managed environmental planning and permitting, security, and regulatory compliance for onshore and offshore operations. She has a hands-on background in performing construction oversight, remote field studies and logistics, incident response, and rehabilitation of contaminated sites. Jocelyn's work has led her to over 30 remote communities across Alaska and other countries such as Norway, Denmark, Japan, and Canada.

Ms. Fenton also serves on several boards dedicated to Arctic leadership and Alaska resources. She holds a Bachelor of Science in natural science and a Master's in applied environmental science and technology from the University of Alaska.
