Born and raised on his family's farm, Taylor is a fifth-generation Missourian who has served three overseas deployments as an officer in the United States Navy. Growing up in the Ozarks, Taylor learned the value of hard work and dedication from life on his grandparent's cattle farm. A graduate of Truman State University, later earning two Master's degrees while on active duty in the Navy, he was the first in his family to finish college.

Taylor served nearly eight years on active duty before returning home, yet continues to serve in the US Navy Reserves as a lieutenant commander. A highly decorated veteran, his personal awards include the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Joint Commendation Medal, two Navy Commendation Medals, and two Navy Achievement Medals.

In 2017, Missouri's Governor appointed Taylor to fill a vacancy in county office, as Boone County's first Republican to serve as County Clerk, where he saved nearly half a million dollars in his first two years in office. He also ran the highest turnout midterm election in 2018, where he earned more votes than any other Republican in Boone by running on a platform of election integrity and preventing voter fraud through commonsense election protections. In 2019, Taylor was named to Governor Parson's administration as Director of Labor Standards for the State of Missouri.

Then, in 2022, Taylor joined Rost, Incorporated, as President and General Manager as the founders, Tim & Toby Rost, plan for the next generation of leadership in their company. As mid-Missouri's premier landscape design and build firm, Rost Inc. now includes six divisions in the company, and a parent company of Midway Golf Games & 44 Tavern.
