II. Background

In accordance with House Resolution Five, each standing committee (other than the Committee on Ethics) must hold a Member Day Hearing during the first session of the 118th Congress to receive testimony from Members, Delegates, and the Resident Commissioner on proposed legislation within its jurisdiction.

Small businesses continue to face a myriad of challenges including shouldering a disproportionate burden from high inflation rates and a lack of access to capital. Small businesses make up 99.9 percent of all businesses in the United States, impacting every district for every Member of Congress. The goal of this hearing is to allow Members who do not sit on the Committee an opportunity to talk about the issues small businesses in their district are facing as they amplify the voices of and advocate for small businesses across the country.
