

Lisa J. Danetz is an Advisor for the Brennan Center for Justice at NYU School of Law and an independent consultant who has worked in the democracy field as a policy expert, advocate, and lawyer for over 20 years. The majority of her work has centered on public policy research, executive and legislative advocacy, and enforcement action related to motor-voter and agency-based voter registration under the National Voter Registration Act of 1993. Danetz has consistently published and spoken about motor-voter and agency-based registration, including in testimony before the Senate Rules and Administration Committee, the Subcommittee on Elections of the House Committee on House Administration, and the United States Commission on Civil Rights.
