Dr. Keith E. Gunuskey is the Superintendent of the Wallenpaupack Area School District in northeastern Pennsylvania, a role he has held since 2021. He has dedicated more than 28 years to public education, serving as a teacher, assistant principal, principal, assistant superintendent, and district leader, with extensive experience in instructional leadership, school safety, workforce development, and community engagement. His career reflects a deep commitment to student success, organizational improvement, and public service.

Dr. Gunuskey earned his Doctor of Education in Leadership Studies with a concentration in Emergency Management and Disaster Preparedness from Louisiana State University–Shreveport. He also holds multiple graduate degrees in educational leadership and classroom technology, along with superintendent and principal certifications. His academic background supports his work in building resilient school systems, strengthening community partnerships, and aligning education with workforce needs.

Throughout his tenure in Wallenpaupack, Dr. Gunuskey has led district-wide initiatives focused on safety planning, crisis response, truancy reduction, curriculum alignment, and career and technical education.
