



Andrew Pahutski is Vice President for Economic Security Programs at Systems Planning & Analysis (SPA) and serves as SPA's Fellow for Economic Security. He is also a Guest Professor at Georgetown University's in the graduate Security Studies Program. He leads initiatives that integrate economic statecraft, industrial base resilience, and technology protection into national security strategy, helping government and allied partners address risks to critical technologies, supply chains, and strategic investment. In his current role, he advises U.S. and foreign governments on national and economic security matters, particularly foreign direct investment screening, strategic risk, and technology protection, including providing direct counsel to legislators and senior officials at the highest levels of government. His work focuses on aligning policy, acquisition, and operational execution to strengthen U.S. and allied economic security and defense industrial competitiveness.



Prior to joining SPA in 2022, Mr. Pahutski completed more than 27 years of combined military and civilian service, including Senior Executive Service assignments in the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition and Sustainment (OUSD(A&S)). As Director of Foreign Investment Review from 2020 to 2022, he represented the Department of Defense on the Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States (CFIUS), where he led DoD's review of foreign mergers, acquisitions, and investments affecting national security. He also led interagency telecommunications security reviews and congressionally directed National Technology and Industrial Base initiatives to strengthen collaboration with key allies and improve supply chain resilience.

Earlier, he served as a Highly Qualified Expert and senior advisor to the Director of the Strategic Capabilities Office (SCO), where he led a two-year Cyber Command and Control Situational Awareness effort to improve operator and commander visibility and control. This work supported mission management, planning, execution, and effects assessment across cyber operations. He also held senior roles supporting defense acquisition, industrial base analysis, and mission assurance initiatives across the Department of Defense.

Mr. Pahutski began his DoD career in the U.S. Army Acquisition Corps, where he led test and evaluation programs supporting force protection, survivability, and capability modernization for deployed forces. He holds a Bachelor of Science in Economics and Business Administration (Finance) from Salisbury University and has completed advanced professional military and acquisition training. He is a recipient of the Secretary of Defense Exceptional Civilian Service Award and the Department of the Army Distinguished Civilian Service Award, the highest civilian honors awarded by the Department of Defense and the Department of the Army, respectively.
