As the CEO of Flex, Sharp advocates for policies that encourage entrepreneurship, provide flexibility and independence to workers, support economic growth, solve public policy problems, and increase safety and access for. Founded in 2021, Flex is the trade association that represents app-based platforms and the people and businesses that rely on them. Members include Uber, Lyft, DoorDash, Grubhub, Instacart, Shipt, and HopSkipDrive.

Prior to joining Flex, Sharp was CEO of Jobs for the Future's Education Quality Outcomes Standards (EQOS) board, a non-profit focused on certifying short-term tech and workforce programs. She also co-founded Shift: The Commission on Work, Workers, and Technology, a joint project of New America and Bloomberg Beta examining the impact of AI on work. Before that, she worked on technology, innovation, and national security policy in the U.S. Senate for committees and senators on both sides of the political aisle.
