Dr. Corbin has forged partnerships with national foundations and corporations to advance educational programming in STEM, the skilled trades, financial management, design thinking, and intellectual property. With her

leadership, NACCE re-granted more than \$6 million back to its members in the past few years.

Dr. Corbin is a co-author of many articles and three books on community college entrepreneurship, the publisher of *Community College Entrepreneurship* magazine, and the co-host of the weekly podcast *Making Our Way Forward* with listeners in more than 425 U.S. cities and 31 countries.

Before she began serving as NACCE's CEO in 2015, Dr. Corbin served for six years at Rowan College at Burlington County in New Jersey as the Executive Director of the RCBC Foundation, Interim Dean of Workforce Development, and Vice President of Institutional Advancement. She earned her doctorate in organizational leadership and innovation from Wilmington University in Delaware, where she was also awarded the Audrey K. Doberstein Award for Leadership in 2016. She serves as a member of the Cary Chamber Board of Commerce, a member of the Small Business Administration (SBA) Equity Roundtable, and a Fellow for the Direct Selling Educational Foundation.
