

Kelly Gaither is the Director of Visualization and a Senior Research Scientist at the Texas Advanced Computing Center. She also serves as the area co-director for visualization in the National Science Foundation funded XSEDE project. Gaither received her doctoral degree in Computational Engineering from Mississippi State University in May 2000, and received her masters and bachelors degree in Computer Science from Texas A&M University in 1992 and 1988 respectively.
