Greg Winfree was appointed agency director of the Texas A&M Transportation Institute (TTI) in December 2016. In this role, he leads the largest and most comprehensive higher education-affiliated transportation research institute in the United States. He represents TTI within The Texas A&M University System, reporting to the vice chancellor for engineering, and serves as the Institute's liaison to the Texas Legislature.

Winfree is a member of NASA's Presidential National Space-Based Positioning, Navigation, and Timing Advisory Board; the Texas Connected and Automated Vehicle Task Force; the Transportation Research Board AV Forum; board member on the Airo Group; Chairman, Resilience, Navigation, and Timing Foundation; and a board member on the International Advisory Board for Development of Smart Mobility Platform. He serves as an adjunct professor at the Texas A&M School of Law.

Before joining TTI, Winfree spent nearly seven years at the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT), most recently as assistant secretary of transportation overseeing the department's research and technology programs. A lifelong attorney, he served in the Civil Rights Division of the U.S. Department of Justice and worked as corporate counsel for several Fortune 500 companies. He holds a Juris Doctor from Georgetown University and a Bachelor of Science from St. John's University.
