

James S. Ulvestad



Dr. James S. Ulvestad is the Division Director of the Division of Astronomical Sciences in the Directorate for Mathematical and Physical Sciences at the National Science Foundation, a position he has held since 2010. He leads a staff of 25 and oversees an annual budget of \$246 million, plus major observatory construction projects with an additional budget of \$100 million in FY 2016. Dr. Ulvestad earned a Bachelor's degree in astronomy from the University of California at Los Angeles and a Ph.D. degree in astronomy from the University of Maryland. He was previously an Assistant Director of the National Radio Astronomy Observatory (NRAO), where he was in charge of the Very Large Array and Very Long Baseline Array radio telescopes, and later was the head of the NRAO New Initiatives Office. Before his time at NRAO, Dr. Ulvestad served in various capacities at the NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory, where he played important roles in several interagency and international programs. Among his community service activities, Dr. Ulvestad chaired the Demographics Study Group of the 2010 National Academies decadal survey in astronomy and astrophysics, was an elected member of the American Astronomical Society Council, and has been a member of NASA's Structure and Evolution of the Universe Subcommittee.
