

## Joshua Corman

Joshua Corman leads the UnDisruptable27 (U27) project at the Institute for Security and Technology (IST). U27 exists to translate high-level risk awareness into local readiness. Focusing at the nexus of water infrastructure and emergency healthcare, this initiative responds to an urgent reality: critical infrastructure faces a multidimensional threat, and most communities remain underprepared.



Throughout his career, Josh has been at the center of conversations about the cybersecurity of technologies that underpin lifeline critical infrastructure. In the domain of civil society, he founded I Am The Cavalry, a grassroots organization of security researchers focused on the intersection of digital security, public safety, and human life. He also co-created the CyberMed Summit, world's only clinically-oriented healthcare cybersecurity conference and served as director of the Atlantic Council's Cyber Statecraft Initiative.

During the pandemic, he served as the chief strategist for the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency's COVID Task Force, where he advised on the pandemic response, provided cybersecurity expertise on healthcare infrastructure supporting Operation Warp Speed, and supported control systems and life safety initiatives. Josh also served as a member of the Task Force for Healthcare Industry Cybersecurity, chartered by Congress in 2015.

In industry, Josh was SVP and chief security officer at PTC, where he accelerated cyber safety maturity across industries. He also served as chief technology officer at Sonatype and in leadership roles at Akamai, IBM, and the 451 Group.

A proud Granite Stater, Josh is a graduate of the University of New Hampshire and continues to live there.
