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ATTACHMENT (Questions #5, #8)

IBM is a vendor – competing for information technology business – across the Federal Government, including the Legislative, Executive and Judicial branches, as well as independent establishments and government corporations. Our contracts are numerous and vary at any given time. IBM's Federal business has been awarded a number of federal contracts since October 1, 2010, as either a prime or subcontractor. These contracts were principally for IT-related services and, in total, represent less than 4% percent of IBM's 2012 revenue. IBM has contracts to perform research and provide high end computing products and services to several federal agencies including the Department of Energy and the Department of Defense.
