Dr. Narasimha D. Rao is an Associate Professor of Energy Systems at the Yale School of the Environment. He also serves as a Senior Research Scholar at the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis. Dr. Rao's research examines energy systems, climate change and human development. He is particularly interested in equity in energy transitions, and the impacts of climate change and its mitigation on poverty around the world.
