

Nathan Anderson serves as a Director in the U.S. and International Nuclear Security and Cleanup group. His work contributes to two High Risk areas—DOE project and contract management and the U.S. Government's environmental liabilities. He previously served as a Director in the Homeland Security and Justice team where his areas of responsibility included Coast Guard and Maritime Security issues, as well as critical infrastructure protection issues. Before his appointment to the Senior Executive Service, Mr. Anderson served as an Assistant Director where he led a suite of projects examining DOE nuclear waste cleanup issues. Mr. Anderson has also been involved in several institutional stewardship activities. He helped lead GAO's work for the International Organization of Supreme Audit Institutions' (INTOSAI) Working Group on Environmental Auditing, which culminated in a framework to help national audit offices with fewer resources design and implement audits for environmental issues.

Mr. Anderson joined GAO in 2001 after graduating from Whitman College with a bachelor's degree in economics and Georgetown University with a master's degree in public policy. He completed American University's Key Executive Leadership Certificate Program in 2018 and also holds a graduate certificate in international business management from Oxford University.
