Jennifer A. Springmann is the Special Agent in Charge, performing the duties of the Assistant Inspector General for Investigations, for the U.S. National Science Foundation (NSF) Office of Inspector General (OIG). In this role, Ms. Springmann leads a team of special agents, investigative attorneys, and investigative support staff who investigate allegations of wrongdoing involving organizations or individuals that receive awards from, conduct business with, or work for NSF. Ms. Springmann's team focuses on allegations concerning the misuse of NSF funds, false statements in documents submitted to NSF, sexual assault and stalking in the U.S. Antarctic Program, research misconduct, and whistleblower retaliation. These investigations result in a variety of outcomes, including criminal prosecutions, civil settlements, and administrative recommendations to NSF.

In her 22 years with NSF OIG, Ms. Springmann has held various roles, including auditor, general investigator, and special agent. She earned her B.S. in Business Administration from Mary Washington College and is a licensed CPA and a certified fraud examiner.
