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Dr. Martin Makary is professor at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and a member of the National Academy of Medicine. He served in leadership at the World Health Organization and has published over 250 scientific articles including studies on Covid-19. A public health and public policy researcher, he leads a Johns Hopkins project on the “re-design of health care” to make health care more reliable and more affordable, especially for vulnerable populations. He is the recipient of the 2020 Business Book of the Year Award for his most New York Times bestselling book, [*The Price We Pay*](#), about rising medical prices in America and the grassroots movement to increase health care transparency.

Clinically, Dr. Makary is the chief of Islet Transplant Surgery at Johns Hopkins and is the recipient of the Nobility in Science Award from the National Pancreas Foundation. He has been a visiting professor at over 25 medical schools and has written extensively on the critical appraisal of scientific research and the evaluation of new medical interventions. He was the first editor-in-chief of Medpage Today and is currently on the editorial board of Sensible Medicine. He has written for the Wall Street Journal and the Washington Post.

Dr. Makary is a graduate of Bucknell University, Jefferson Medical College, and the Harvard School of Public Health. He completed a surgical residency at Georgetown University and his sub-specialty training at Johns Hopkins.
