Dr. Thorp became Editor-in-Chief of the *Science* family of journals on 28 October 2019. He also holds faculty appointments in chemistry and medicine at The George Washington University. He came to *Science* from Washington University in St. Louis, where he was provost and Rita Levi-Montalcini Dis@nguished University Professor from 2013 to 2019. He joined Washington University a]er spending three decades at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (UNC), where he served as the 10th chancellor from 2008 to 2013.

A North Carolina na@ve, Dr. Thorp started at UNC as an undergraduate student and earned a bachelor of

science degree in chemistry in 1986. He earned a doctorate in chemistry in 1989 at the California Ins@tute of Technology. He holds an honorary doctor of laws degree from North Carolina Wesleyan College, is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and is a fellow of the American Associa@on for the Advancement of Science and the Na@onal Academy of Inventors.
