As a Senior Field Service representative, Warren conducted site visits to the various Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) Medical facilities in conjunction with the American Legion's "A System Worth Saving" Program. Warren's responsibilities for The American Legion included issue and subject matter analysis for the VA National Cemetery Administration (NCA), Veterans Health Administration (VHA) offices for Quality, Safety, and Value, Advisory Committee on Structural Safety of VA Facilities, and Research Advisory Committee on Gulf War Veterans.
