





As Deputy Chief Patient Care Services Officer, Dr. McCarthy serves as a consultant to the Chief Patient Care Services Officer and the Deputy Under Secretary for Health for Policy and Services (DUSHPS) on all policy matters and issues that relate to patient care and clinical services. The focus of the Deputy Chief Patient Care Services Officer (DCPCSO) is to support the vision of the Under Secretary for Health and VHA's mission in offering the highest quality health care to our Veterans. The DCPCSO works with all clinical programs to form an active and coordinated interdisciplinary team in order to articulate an integrated overview of Veterans health issues. The DCPCSO plays a key role in effectively addressing Veteran health care needs through the development of clinical guidelines and standards for clinical care programs and providers.



Dr. McCarthy has a 23-year history of service to the Veteran community including in her prior role as Chief of Staff at the Salem VA Medical Center, which she has held for five years. As Chief of Staff, Dr. McCarthy functioned in a major clinical leadership role at the Salem VAMC, which serves a population of approximately 36,000 Veterans. Dr. McCarthy also has served as Associate Chief of Staff for Education and staff psychiatrist at the Salem VAMC and has served in staff psychiatrist position at the Washington, DC VA Medical Center. While in VA Central Office, she continues to provide treatment to a small number of Veterans by telemedicine.
