Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute to H.R. 2915

OFFERED BY MS. BROWNLEY OF CALIFORNIA

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Female Veteran Sui-3 cide Prevention Act".

4 SEC. 2. SPECIFIC CONSIDERATION OF WOMEN VETERANS 5 IN EVALUATION OF DEPARTMENT OF VET-6 ERANS AFFAIRS MENTAL HEALTH CARE AND 7 SUICIDE PREVENTION PROGRAMS. 8 Section 1709B(a)(2) of title 38, United States Code, 9 is amended— 10 (1) in subparagraph (A), by inserting before the semicolon the following: ", including specific metrics 11 12 applicable to women"; 13 (2) in subparagraph (D), by striking "and" at 14 the end; 15 (3) in subparagraph (E), by striking the period at the end and inserting "; and"; and 16

17 (4) by adding at the end the following new sub-18 paragraph:

"(F) identify the mental health care and suicide
 prevention programs conducted by the Secretary
 that are most effective for women veterans and such
 programs with the highest satisfaction rates among
 women veterans.".

6 SEC. 3. MENTAL HEALTH TREATMENT FOR VETERANS WHO 7 SERVED IN CLASSIFIED MISSIONS.

8 (a) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of Con-9 gress that veterans who experience combat-related mental 10 health wounds should have immediate, appropriate, and 11 consistent access to comprehensive mental health care.

(b) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 17 of
title 38, United States Code, is amended by adding at the
end the following section:

15 "§ 1720H. Mental health treatment for veterans who 16 served in classified missions

17 "(a) ESTABLISHMENT OF STANDARDS.—(1) The 18 Secretary shall establish standards and procedures to en-19 sure that each covered veteran may access mental health 20 care provided by the Secretary in a manner that fully ac-21 commodates the obligation of the veteran to not improp-22 erly disclose classified information.

"(2) The Secretary shall disseminate guidance to employees of the Veterans Health Administration, including
mental health professionals, on the standards and proce-

dures established under paragraph (1) and how to best
 engage covered veterans during the course of mental
 health treatment with respect to classified information.

4 "(b) IDENTIFICATION.—In carrying out this section,
5 the Secretary shall ensure that a veteran may elect to
6 identify as a covered veteran on an appropriate form.

7 "(c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

8 "(1) The term 'classified information' means 9 any information or material that has been deter-10 mined by an official of the United States pursuant 11 to law, an Executive order, or regulation to require 12 protection against unauthorized disclosure for rea-13 sons of national security.

14 "(2) The term 'covered veteran' means a vet-15 eran who—

16 "(A) is enrolled in the health care system
17 established under section 1705(a) of this title;
18 "(B) is seeking mental health treatment;
19 and

20 "(C) in the course of serving in the Armed
21 Forces, participated in a sensitive mission or
22 served in a sensitive unit.

23 "(3) The term 'sensitive mission' means a mis24 sion of the Armed Forces that, at the time at which
25 a covered veteran seeks treatment, is classified.

"(4) The term 'sensitive unit' has the meaning
 given that term in section 130b(c)(4) of title 10.".
 (c) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
 at the beginning of such chapter is amended by adding
 after the item relating to section 1720G the following new
 item:

Amend the title so as to read: "A bill to amend title 38, United States Code, to direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to identify mental health care and suicide prevention programs and metrics that are effective in treating women veterans as part of the evaluation of such programs by the Secretary, and for other purposes.".
