A BILL

- To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to reduce the backlog of requests for information made to the Department of Veterans Affairs pursuant to section 552 of title 5, United States Code, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- This Act may be cited as the "VA FOIA Reform Act
- 5 of 2020".
- 6 SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF BACKLOG OF CERTAIN REQUESTS
- 7 FOR INFORMATION.
- 8 (a) Reduction of Backlogs.—

- 1 (1) FOIA.—By not later than three years after
 2 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
 3 of Veterans Affairs shall reduce the backlog of
 4 FOIA requests by 75 percent.
- 5 (2) OFFICE OF SPECIAL COUNSEL.—By not 6 later than three years after the date of the enact-7 ment of this Act, the Secretary shall reduce the 8 backlog of Special Counsel requests by 75 percent.
- 9 (b) Proactive Disclosures.—On an ongoing basis,
- 10 the Secretary shall determine the documents, records, and
- 11 information of the Department of Veterans Affairs that
- 12 are the types of documents, records, and information of
- 13 the Department that the Secretary determines are fre-
- 14 quently requested and provided pursuant to section 552
- 15 of title 5, United States Code. The Secretary shall regu-
- 16 larly make such documents, records, and information pub-
- 17 liely available, including by publishing such documents,
- 18 records, and information on the internet website of the
- 19 Department.
- 20 (c) Compliance Assessment.—The Secretary shall
- 21 request the Director of the Office of Government Informa-
- 22 tion Services of the National Archives and Records Admin-
- 23 istration to conduct an assessment of the compliance by
- 24 the Department of Veterans Affairs with section 552 of
- 25 title 5, United States Code.

(d) Reports.—

- (1) INITIAL REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit to the Committees on Veterans' Affairs of the House of Representatives and the Senate a report on implementing subsections (a) and (b). The report shall include the following:
 - (A) A plan for such implementation.
 - (B) An analysis of the root causes of the backlog of FOIA requests and the backlog of Special Counsel requests.
 - (C) A plan to improve and acquire technology, including with respect to searching email and other electronic information, and the timelines for such improvement, to ensure that the information technology of the Department of Veterans Affairs is capable of carrying out such plan.
 - (D) Identification of efficient procedures, policies, and systems of the Department that could be developed to allow employees of the Department responsible for replying to requests under section 552 of title 5, United States Code, to search and review documents rather than other employees of the Department.

1	(E) Identification of the documents and in-
2	formation that will be made publicly available
3	under subsection (b) and identification of the
4	10 most frequently requested types of docu-
5	ments, records, or information.
6	(F) Recommendations with respect to any
7	additional resources or legislative action the
8	Secretary determines necessary for such imple-
9	mentation.
10	(2) Annual reports.—During the three-year
11	period following the date of the enactment of this
12	Act, the Secretary shall submit to the Committees
13	on Veterans' Affairs of the House of Representatives
14	and the Senate annual reports on implementing sub-
15	sections (a) and (b).
6	(3) Publication.—The Secretary shall make
7	publicly available on the internet website of the De-
8	partment the reports under paragraphs (1) and (2)
9	by not later than 30 days after the date on which
20	the Secretary submits the reports to the Committees
21	on Veterans' Affairs of the House of Representatives
22	and the Senate.
23	(e) Definitions.—In this section:
4	(1) The term "backlog of FOIA requests"

means the number of requests, as reported by the

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Secretary of Veterans Affairs to the Attorney General in the Annual FOIA Report for Fiscal Year 2019, made by individuals to the Secretary pursuant to section 552 of title 5, United States Code, for documents or information that the Secretary has not fulfilled or provided a response to the individual.

(2) The term "backlog of Special Counsel requests" means the number of requests, as determined by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs by not later than 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, made by the Special Counsel to the Secretary pursuant to chapter 12 of part II of title 5, United States Code, for documents or information that the Secretary has not fulfilled or provided a response to the Office of Special Counsel.

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
