## AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE TO H.R. 1448

## Offered by M\_..

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
2	This Act may be cited as the "Puppies Assisting
3	Wounded Servicemembers for Veterans Therapy Act" or
4	the "PAWS for Veterans Therapy Act".
5	SEC. 2. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS PILOT PRO-
6	GRAM ON DOG TRAINING THERAPY.
7	(a) In General.—Not later than 180 days after the
8	date of the enactment of the Act, the Secretary of Vet-
9	erans Affairs shall commence the conduct of a pilot pro-
10	gram to provide canine training to eligible veterans diag-
11	nosed with post-traumatic stress disorder (in this section
12	referred to as "PTSD") as an element of a complementary
13	and integrative health program for such veterans.
14	(b) Duration; Medical Centers.—
15	(1) Duration.—The Secretary shall carry out
16	the pilot program under subsection (a) for a five-
17	year period beginning on the date of the commence-
18	ment of the pilot program.

1	(2) Medical centers.—The Secretary shall
2	ensure that such pilot program is carried out by not
3	fewer than five medical centers of the Department of
4	Veterans Affairs located in geographically diverse
5	areas.
6	(c) Agreements With Entities.—In carrying out
7	the pilot program under subsection (a), the Secretary shall
8	seek to enter into agreements with nongovernmental enti-
9	ties that the Secretary determines have the demonstrated
10	ability to provide the canine training specified in sub-
11	section (a).
12	(d) REQUIRED CONDITIONS.—The Secretary shall in-
13	clude in any agreement under subsection (c) conditions re-
14	quiring that the nongovernmental entity seeking to enter
15	into the agreement—
16	(1) submits to the Secretary certification that
17	the entity is an accredited service dog training orga-
18	nization;
19	(2) agrees to ensure that veterans participating
20	in the pilot program under subsection (a) receive
21	training from certified service dog training instruc-
22	tors for a period of time determined appropriate by
23	the entity;
24	(3) agrees to ensure that veterans participating
25	in such pilot program are prohibited from having ac-

1	cess to a dog under such pilot program at any time
2	during such participation without the supervision of
3	a certified service dog training instructor;
4	(4) agrees to ensure that veterans participating
5	in such pilot program receive training in skills
6	unique to the needs of the veteran to address or al-
7	leviate PTSD symptoms of the veteran;
8	(5) agrees not to use shock collars or prong col-
9	lars as training tools and to use positive reinforce-
10	ment training; and
11	(6) agrees to provide any follow-up training
12	support specified in subsection (e)(2), as applicable.
13	(e) Adoption of Dog.—
14	(1) In general.—A veteran who has partici-
15	pated in the pilot program under subsection (a) may
16	adopt a dog that the veteran assisted in training
17	during such pilot program if the veteran and the vet-
18	eran's health provider (in consultation with the enti-
19	ty that provided the canine training with respect to
20	the dog under such pilot program) determine that it
21	is in the best interest of the veteran.
22	(2) Follow-up training support.—If a vet-
23	eran adopts a dog under paragraph (1), the entity
24	that provided the canine training with respect to the
25	dog under the pilot program shall provide follow-up

1	training support for the life of the dog. Such sup-
2	port shall include the provision of a contact plan be-
3	tween the veteran and the entity that enables the
4	veteran to seek and receive assistance from the enti-
5	ty to ensure the dog is being properly cared for.
6	(f) Eligibility for Other Care and Treat-
7	MENT.—Participation in the pilot program under sub-
8	section (a) may not preclude a veteran from receiving any
9	other medical care or treatment for PTSD furnished by
10	the Department, including therapy, for which the veteran
11	is otherwise eligible.
12	(g) Collection of Data.—In carrying out this sec-
13	tion, the Secretary shall—
14	(1) develop metrics and other appropriate
15	means to measure, with respect to veterans partici-
16	pating in the pilot program under subsection (a)—
17	(A) the number of such veterans partici-
18	pating;
19	(B) the satisfaction of such veterans with
20	the pilot program;
21	(C) whether participation in the pilot pro-
22	gram resulted in any clinically relevant improve-
23	ments for such veterans, as determined by the
24	health care provider or clinical team that re-

1	ferred the veteran to participate in the pilot
2	program; and
3	(D) such other factors as the Secretary
4	may determine appropriate; and
5	(2) establish processes to document and track
6	the progress of such veterans under the pilot pro-
7	gram with respect to health benefits and improve-
8	ments.
9	(h) REPORT BY SECRETARY.—Not later than one
10	year before the date on which the pilot program under
11	subsection (a) terminates, the Secretary shall submit to
12	the Committees on Veterans' Affairs of the House of Rep-
13	resentatives and the Senate a report containing the rec-
14	ommendations of the Secretary regarding—
15	(1) whether to extend or make permanent the
16	pilot program; and
17	(2) the feasibility and advisability of expanding
18	the pilot program to address mental health condi-
19	tions other than PTSD.
20	(i) GAO Briefing and Study.—
21	(1) Briefing.—Not later than one year after
22	the date of the commencement of the pilot program
23	under subsection (a), the Comptroller General of the
24	United States shall provide to the Committees on
25	Veterans' Affairs of the House of Representatives

1	and the Senate a briefing on the methodology estab-
2	lished for the pilot program.
3	(2) Report.—Not later than 270 days after
4	the date on which the pilot program terminates, the
5	Comptroller General shall submit to the committees
6	specified in paragraph (1) a report on the pilot pro-
7	gram. Such report shall include an evaluation of the
8	approach and methodology used for the pilot pro-
9	gram with respect to—
10	(A) assisting veterans with PTSD; and
11	(B) measuring relevant metrics, such as
12	reduction in scores under the Clinician Admin-
13	istered PTSD Scale (CAPS), improvement in
14	psychosocial function, and therapeutic compli-
15	ance.
16	(j) Definitions.—In this section:
17	(1) The term "accredited service dog training
18	organization" means an organization described in
19	section $501(c)(3)$ of the Internal Revenue Code of
20	1986 that—
21	(A) provides service dogs to veterans with
22	PTSD; and
23	(B) is accredited by an accrediting organi-
24	zation with demonstrated experience, national
25	scope, and recognized leadership and expertise

1	in the training of service dogs and education in
2	the use of service dogs (as determined by the
3	Secretary).
4	(2) The term "eligible veteran" means a vet-
5	eran who—
6	(A) is enrolled in the patient enrollment
7	system in the Department of Veterans Affairs
8	under section 1705 of title 38, United States
9	Code; and
10	(B) has been recommended for participa-
11	tion in the pilot program under subsection (a)
12	by a qualified mental health care provider or
13	clinical team based on medical judgment that
14	the veteran may benefit from such participation
15	with respect to the diagnosed PTSD of the vet-
16	eran.
17	(3) The term "service dog training instructor"
18	means an instructor who provides the direct training
19	of veterans with PTSD in the art and science of
20	service dog training and handling.

1	SEC. 3. PROVISION OF SERVICE DOGS AND VETERINARY IN-
2	SURANCE BENEFITS TO VETERANS WITH
3	POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER WHO
4	DO NOT HAVE CERTAIN IMPAIRMENTS.
5	(a) In General.—Section 1714 of title 38, United
6	States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
7	lowing new subsections:
8	"(e) The Secretary may provide a service dog to a
9	veteran under subsection (c)(3) regardless of whether the
10	veteran has a mobility impairment.
11	``(f)(1) The Secretary shall provide to any veteran de-
12	scribed in paragraph (2) a commercially available veteri-
13	nary insurance policy for each dog provided to such vet-
14	eran under subsection (b) or (c).
15	"(2) A veteran described in this paragraph is a vet-
16	eran who—
17	"(A) is diagnosed with post-traumatic stress
18	disorder or a visual, hearing, or substantial mobility
19	impairment;
20	"(B) has received a dog under subsection (b) or
21	(c) in connection with such disorder or impairment;
22	and
23	"(C) meets such other requirements as the Sec-
24	retary may prescribe.".
25	(b) Applicability.—Section 1714(f) of title 38,
26	United States Code, as added by subsection (a), shall

- 1 apply with respect to a veteran provided a dog by the Sec-
- 2 retary of Veterans Affairs regardless of whether the provi-
- 3 sion occurs before, on, or after the date of the enactment
- 4 of this Act.
