AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE TO H.R. 912

OFFERED BY Ms. Brownley

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "American Indian and3 Alaska Native Veterans Mental Health Act".

4 SEC. 2. MENTAL HEALTH AND SUICIDE PREVENTION OUT5 REACH TO MINORITY VETERANS AND AMER6 ICAN INDIAN AND ALASKA NATIVE VET7 ERANS.

8 (a) STAFFING REQUIREMENT.—Beginning not later 9 than 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, 10 the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall ensure that each 11 medical center of the Department of Veterans Affairs has 12 not fewer than one full-time employee whose responsibility 13 is serving as a minority veteran coordinator.

(b) TRAINING.—Not later than 180 days after the
date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary, in consultation with the Director of the Indian Health Service
and the Director of the Office of Mental Health and Suicide Prevention of the Department of Veterans Affairs,

shall ensure that all minority veteran coordinators receive
 training in the delivery of culturally appropriate mental
 health and suicide prevention services to American Indian
 and Alaska Native veterans, especially with respect to the
 identified populations and tribes within the coordinators'
 catchment areas.

7 (c) COORDINATION WITH SUICIDE PREVENTION CO-8 ORDINATORS.—Not later than 180 days after the date of 9 the enactment of this Act, the Secretary, in consultation 10 with the Director of the Office of Mental Health and Suicide Prevention, shall ensure that the suicide prevention 11 12 coordinator and minority veteran coordinator of each med-13 ical center of the Department have developed and disseminated to the director of the medical center a written plan 14 15 for conducting mental health and suicide prevention outreach to all tribes and urban Indian health organizations 16 within the catchment area of the medical center. Each 17 18 such plan shall include for each tribe covered by the 19 plan—

20 (1) contact information for tribal leadership
21 and the tribal health facility or Indian Health Serv22 ice facility serving that tribe;

(2) a schedule for and list of outreach plans
(including addressing any barriers to accessing Department mental health care); and

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(3) documentation of any conversation with
 tribal leaders that may guide culturally appropriate
 delivery of mental health care to American Indian or
 Alaska Native veterans.

5 (d) REPORT.—Not later than one year after the date 6 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit 7 to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and 8 the House of Representatives a report on outreach efforts 9 to minority veterans and American Indian and Alaska Na-10 tive veterans. Such report shall include each of the fol-11 lowing:

12 (1) The number of minority veteran coordina-13 tors within the Department.

14 (2) The number and percentage of minority vet-15 eran coordinators who are women.

16 (3) The number and percentage of minority vet-17 eran coordinators who are persons of color.

18 (4) The number and percentage of Department19 medical centers with minority veteran coordinators.

20 (5) The number and percentage of Department
21 mental health providers who are enrolled members of
22 a federally recognized Indian tribe or self-identify as
23 Native American.

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(6) The number and percentage of Department
 mental health providers who speak a second lan guage.

4 (7) A review of the outreach plans developed 5 and submitted to all Department medical centers for 6 outreach to American Indian and Alaska Native vet-7 erans.

8 (8) A review of mental health care provided an-9 nually by the Department to American Indian and 10 Alaska Native veterans for the past three years, in-11 cluding number of appointments, and an assessment 12 of any barriers to providing this care.

13 SEC. 3. INCLUSION OF AMERICAN INDIAN AND ALASKA NA-

14TIVE TRIBES UNDER DEPARTMENT OF VET-15ERANS AFFAIRS GOVERNORS CHALLENGE16PROGRAM.

17 The Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall carry out a 18 grant program to be known as the "Governors Challenge 19 Program" under which the Secretary shall provide tech-20 nical assistance to States and American Indian and Alaska 21 Native tribes for the development of veteran suicide pre-22 vention activities.

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
