6 (a) WAIVER OF VERIFICATION OF ENROLLMENT FOR
7 CERTAIN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS.—Section 3313(l)
8 of title 38, United States Code, is amended by adding at
9 the end the following new paragraph:

10 "(4) WAIVER.—The Secretary may waive the 11 requirements of this subsection for an educational 12 institution that the Secretary has determined uses a 13 flat tuition and fee structure that would make the 14 use of a second verification under this subsection 15 unnecessary.".

16 (b) LIMITATIONS ON AUTHORITY TO DISAPPROVE OF17 COURSES.—

18 (1) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (f) of section
19 3679 of title 38, United States Code, is amended—
20 (A) in paragraph (2)(B)—

1	(i) by inserting ", except for the re-
2	cruitment of foreign students residing in
3	foreign countries who are not eligible to re-
4	ceive Federal student assistance" after
5	"assistance"; and
6	(ii) by adding at the end the following
7	new subparagraph:
8	"(C) In determining whether a violation of sub-
9	paragraph (B) has occurred, the State approving
10	agency, or the Secretary when acting in the place of
11	the State approving agency, shall construe the re-
12	quirements of this paragraph in accordance with the
13	regulations and guidance prescribed by the Secretary
14	of Education under section 487(a)(20) of the Higher
15	Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1094(a)(20)).";
16	(B) by redesignating paragraph $(7)$ as
17	paragraph (8); and
18	(C) by inserting after paragraph (6) the
19	following new paragraph (7):
20	((7) This subsection shall not apply to an educational
21	institution-
22	"(A) located in a foreign country; or
23	"(B) that provides to a covered individual con-
24	sumer information regarding costs of the program of
25	education (including financial aid available to such

1	covered individual) using a form or template devel-

3	(2) Application date.—The Secretary of Vet-
4	erans Affairs may not carry out subsection (f) of

1	SEC. 4. PROVISION OF EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE TO STU-
2	DENTS WHO ARE "ROUNDING OUT" UNDER
3	EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS OF
4	DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS.
5	(a) IN GENERAL.—Section 3680(a) of title 38,
6	United States Code, is amended—
7	(1) in paragraph $(1)$ , in the matter before sub-
8	paragraph (A), by striking "in paragraph (2)" and
9	inserting "in paragraphs (2) and (3)"; and
10	(2) by adding at the end the following new
11	paragraph:
12	"(3) Notwithstanding paragraph $(1)$ , in the
13	case of an eligible veteran or eligible person who is
14	pursuing a program of education on less than a half-
15	time basis during a period that is the last semester,
16	term, or academic period the veteran or person will
17	be enrolled in the program of education because the
18	veteran or person will complete the program of edu-
19	cation at the end of that semester, term, or aca-
20	demic period, the Secretary may, pursuant to such
21	regulations as the Secretary shall prescribe, provide
22	to the veteran or person educational assistance
23	under chapter 30, 32, 33, 34, or 35 of this title or
24	under chapter 1606 of title 10, including a monthly
25	housing stipend described in section 3313(c) of this
26	title, on the basis of the total number of credits or

1	courses in which the veteran or person is enrolled,
2	if—
3	"(A) the number of credits the veteran or
4	person needs to complete the program of edu-
5	cation is less than the number of credits that
6	would constitute enrollment on a more than
7	half-time basis for that last semester, term, or
8	academic period; and
9	"(B) the veteran or person—
10	"(i) is enrolled in, or has completed,
11	every course offered by the program of
12	education during the last semester, term,
13	or academic period in which the veteran or
14	person is enrolled in the program of edu-
15	cation; and
16	"(ii) enrolls in an additional course
17	that is not required for the completion of
18	such program of education and the enroll-
19	ment in the non-required course in addi-
20	tion to the required course or courses in
21	which the veteran or person is enrolled
22	constitutes enrollment on more than a
23	half-time basis.".
24	(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
25	subsection (a) shall take effect on January 1, 2022, and

apply with respect to any semester, term, or academic pe riod that begins on or after that date.

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—In the case of a program of edu-10 cation approved by a State approving agency, or the Secretary of Veterans Affairs when acting in the role of a 11 12 State approving agency, that is converted from being offered on-site at an educational institution to being offered 13 by distance learning by reason of an emergency or health-14 15 related situation, as determined by the Secretary, the Secretary may continue to provide educational assistance 16 under the laws administered by the Secretary without re-17 18 gard to such conversion, including with respect to paying 19 any---

20 (1) monthly housing stipends under chapter 33
21 of title 38, United States Code; or

(2) payments or subsistence allowances under
chapters 30, 31, 32, and 35 of such title and chapters 1606 and 1607 of title 10, United States Code.

(b) APPLICABILITY PERIOD.—Subsection (a) shall
 apply during the period beginning on December 21, 2021,
 and ending on June 1, 2022.
 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

5 (1) The term "educational institution" has the
6 meaning given that term in section 3452 of title 38,
7 United States Code, and includes an institution of
8 higher learning (as defined in such section).

9 (2) The term "program of education" has the
10 meaning given that term in section 3002 of title 38,
11 United States Code.

(3) The term "State approving agency" has the
meaning given that term in section 3671 of title 38,
United States Code.
