

MORGAN BROWN NATIONAL LEGISLATIVE DIRECTOR

Morgan Brown is the National Legislative Director for Paralyzed Veterans of America (PVA) at PVA's National Office in Washington, D.C. He spent much of his nearly 22 years of military service in the law enforcement career field and was affiliated with the service's law enforcement and more specifically, its military working dog program for much of that time. In the summer of 1999, he graduated from the Air Force First Sergeant Academy at Maxwell AFB, Alabama, and was assigned to the 789th Communications Squadron, Andrews AFB, Maryland, where he served until his retirement in 2002.

Since leaving the service, Morgan has served in the government relations departments of three military and veteran service organizations. In 2002 he accepted a position with the Air Force Sergeants Association (AFSA) and for nearly five years, served as one of its principal representatives on legislative matters. From April 2007 to May 10, 2011, he was the Senior Legislative Assistant for the National Association for Uniformed Services (NAUS), focusing on military healthcare and related policy matters. He returned to AFSA as its Legislative Director in May 2011 and for a brief time "retired" in September 2017 to earn a degree in biblical studies. He returned to the advocacy arena and accepted his current position with the Paralyzed Veterans of America in February 2019 where he is now responsible for the planning, coordination, and implementation of strategy to advance the association's varied legislative priorities.

In addition to his work with individual veterans service organizations, he is a former Cochair of The Military Coalition (TMC), a group of 32 military, veterans and uniformed services organizations representing more than 5.5 million members who joined together in pursuit of common goals. He also led TMC Veterans Subcommittee for nearly 14 years.

Morgan graduated from Charis Bible College in the spring of 2018. He is a licensed minister (nondenominational) and serves as the Director of Outreach for his church in Annandale, VA.

He also a life member and very active in numerous veterans and civic associations including the Air Force Sergeants Association, The Retired Enlisted Association, Disabled American Veterans, First Flight Society, Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, and Paralyzed Veterans of America.

Morgan resides in Upper Marlboro, Maryland with his wife Beatrice.
