Cassandra M. Law was appointed by President Joseph R. Biden, Jr. to serve as the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) Assistant Secretary for Human Resources and Administration / Operations, Security and Preparedness on January 18, 2024.

As the Deputy Chief of Staff, she advised senior leadership on the development and implementation of department-wide policies and leads administrative operations in the federal government's second-largest Cabinet department, with a budget of more than \$246 billion and over 460,000 employees serving VA medical centers, clinics, benefits offices, and national cemeteries.

Ms. Law has a distinguished career as a healthcare executive. Prior to joining the Office of the Secretary in 2022, she served 33 years in the Veterans Health Administration serving in key roles including: Deputy Chief of Staff and Chief Consultant to the Deputy Under Secretary for Health where she oversaw 1200 employees and an annual budget of over \$4.8 billion and provided leadership in the areas of human capital management, policy, planning, and finance.
