Rajeev Ramchand is a senior behavioral scientist at the RAND Corporation. His research focuses on the prevalence, prevention, and treatment of mental health and substance use disorders in adolescents, service members and veterans, and minority populations. He has specific interest in the epidemiology of suicide and its prevention, and he was lead author of *The War Within: Preventing Suicide in the U.S. Military* (2011: RAND). He is interested in applying novel approaches in the collection and analysis of survey data and formerly served as associate director of the RAND Center for Military Health Policy Research. In addition to co-leading RAND's 2014 study on military caregivers, *Hidden Heroes*, Dr. Ramchand is currently leading projects at RAND examining disparities in mental health conditions among minority subgroups in the U.S. military and evaluating the types and quality of services provided on suicide crisis hotlines in California.

His research has been published in such journals as the *American Journal of Public Health*, *Journal of Consulting and Clinical Psychology*, *AIDS and Behavior*, *The Journal of Trauma*, and *Journal of Traumatic Stress*.

He received his B.A. in economics from the University of Chicago and his Ph.D. in psychiatric epidemiology from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health.
