Rachel Yehuda, PhD Mental Health Executive James J. Peters Bronx VAMC

Dr. Yehuda is the Director of Mental Health at the James J. Peters Veterans Bronx Veterans Affairs Medical Center (JJP BVA). She is also an Endowed Professor of Psychiatry and Neurobiology of Trauma at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai (ISMMS) in New York City. In addition to her administrative role at the VA, Dr. Yehuda has been an active researcher in the field of PTSD and intergenerational trauma. She has been the recipient of numerous federal research grants and awards. During her 30+ year career she has authored more than 600 scientific publications. In 2019, Dr. Yehuda was elected to the National Academy of Medicine for her contributions to understanding the psychological and biological impact of traumatic stress. In 2020, Dr. Yehuda established and now directs the Center for Psychedelic Psychotherapy and Trauma Research, representing a joint project between the Bronx VA and its academic affiliate, ISMMS.
