

**Erica M. Scavella, M.D., FACP, FACHE** serves as the Assistant Under Secretary for Health for Clinical Services and Chief Medical Officer at the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs overseeing the medical care provided to over 9 million enrolled Veterans annually at over 1,700 sites of care. Dr. Scavella defines VA's clinical strategy and policies to assure the provision of an enterprise-wide, patient-centric, evidence-based standard of care and the reduction of unintended outcomes. Prior to this appointment, Dr. Scavella served as VA's Associate Deputy Under Secretary for Health for Oversight, Risk and Ethics, executing the duties of the Chief Health Risk Officer, and prior to that as The Medical Inspector, conducting and overseeing over 250 clinical investigations.

Dr. Scavella earned a BA in Biology from Rutgers University and an M.D. from Robert Wood Johnson Medical School, Rutgers University. She completed a residency in Internal Medicine at the University of Maryland Medical System and is certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine. She was elected Fellow of the American College of Physicians in 2005 and Fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives in 2012. She completed the Harvard Kennedy School Senior Executive Fellows Program in 2017, is actively engaged with the Association of American Medical Colleges on expanding and lengthening the pipeline for diversity in U.S. medicine and serves on several Boards to include the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education, the National Board of Medical Examiners, AMSUS – The Society of Federal Health Professionals, and the American Hospital Association Chief Physicians Network.
