- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Veterans National

1	SEC. 2. PILOT PROGRAM TO FURNISH HYPERBARIC OXY-
2	GEN THERAPY TO A VETERAN WITH TRAU-
3	MATIC BRAIN INJURY OR POST-TRAUMATIC
4	STRESS DISORDER.
5	(a) Establishment.—The Secretary of Veterans
6	Affairs shall implement a pilot program to furnish HBOT
7	to a veteran who has a traumatic brain injury or post-
8	traumatic stress disorder through a health care provider
9	described in section 1703(c)(5) of title 38, United States
10	Code.
11	(b) Locations.—The Secretary shall select three
12	Veterans Integrated Service Networks in which to operate
13	the pilot program.
14	(c) Funding.—
15	(1) There is in the general fund of the Treasury
16	a fund to be known as the "VA HBOT Fund" (in
17	this Act referred to as the "Fund").
18	(2) The sole source of monies for the Fund
19	shall be donations received by the Secretary for ex-
20	press purposes of the Fund.
21	(3) Amounts in the Fund shall be available to

5	"HBOT" means hyperbaric oxygen therapy with a medical

7	(1) approved by the Food and Drug Adminis-
8	tration; or
9	(2) issued an investigational device exemption
10	by the Food and Drug Administration.
