

Philip Matkovsky

Assistant Deputy Under Secretary for Health for Administrative Operations

Mr. Philip Matkovsky was appointed Assistant Deputy Under Secretary for Health for Administrative Operations, Veterans Health Administration, on June 12, 2011. He serves as the principal advisor to the Deputy Under Secretary for Health for Operations and Management, directing the day-to-day operations of the Office which oversees 21 Veterans Integration Service Networks (VISN). As the ADUSHOM for Administrative Operations, Mr. Matkovsky is directly responsible for managing 10 major healthcare support programs, including Occupational Safety and Health, Emergency Management, Procurement and Logistics, Healthcare Engineering, Capital Asset Management, Environmental Programs and the Veterans Canteen Service.



Mr. Matkovsky previously served as the VHA Deputy Chief Business Officer from 2008 until 2011 where he directed the Member Services Office. As Chief Business Officer, he developed partnerships with Medical Centers, stakeholders and other departments to provide Veterans and their dependents with respectful, timely, accurate and efficient service. Under his leadership, the program experienced significant improvements with measurable, operational impact. These include managing the opening of Enrollment for Certain Priority 8 Veterans, the establishment of new contact management services for Veterans and families, the creation and streamlining of enrollment operations for returning service members at the Health Eligibility Center, and implementation of director-level programs for the Offices of Workforce Management, Systems Management, Business Engineering, Disability Examination Management, Veterans Transportation and VA Point of Service.

Mr. Matkovsky has worked to advance several of VHA's Transformational Initiatives. He led and coordinated the operationalization of Identity Management, Veterans Health Benefits Handbook, Veterans Transportation Service, Beneficiary Travel and Veterans Point of Service.

Prior to joining VHA, Mr. Matkovsky held several senior management and executive level posts, blending administrative, management and technical expertise to oversee the delivery of complex systems to civilian and Defense clients. He also owned and managed a private consulting firm, providing management consulting services to government and public sector clients.

Mr. Matkovsky graduated from the University of Pennsylvania in 1988 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science and earned a Master of Arts degree in Political Science from American University in 1991.
