A BILL

 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Strengthening VA
- 5 Background Checks Act".

1 SEC. 2. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS EMPLOYEE 2 BACKGROUND CHECKS.

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3 (a) PREREQUISITE FOR ISSUING FLASH BADGES TO
4 CERTAIN CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL.—The Secretary of
5 Veterans Affairs shall not issue a flash badge to a covered
6 contractor employee unless a Special Agreement Check of
7 the employee has been conducted.

8 (b) PROCESS FOR REPETITION OF BACKGROUND9 CHECKS.—

10 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Veterans 11 Affairs shall establish a process under which the 12 Secretary shall periodically update suitability deter-13 minations made with respect to employees and con-14 tractor employees of the Department of Veterans Af-15 fairs. Such process may include repeating Special 16 Agreement Checks, National Agency Checks with In-17 quiries, and other means of vetting, after initial suit-18 ability determinations are made.

19 (2) DETERMINATIONS.—In establishing the
20 process described in paragraph (1), the Secretary
21 shall determine—

(A) the number of employees and contractor employees of the Department who are
not subject to updated, recurring, or repeated
suitability determinations as of the date of the
enactment of this Act;

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1	(B) the frequency with which suitability
2	determinations and information informing suit-
3	ability determinations should be updated; and
4	(C) the categories of employees and con-
5	tractor employees that should be given priority
6	in updating suitability determinations.
7	(c) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date
8	of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit
9	to the Committees on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and
10	House of Representatives a report containing each of the
11	following:
12	(1) The number of employees and contractor
13	employees of the Department of Veterans Affairs
14	who hold flash badges.
15	(2) The number of employees for whom Special
16	Agreement Checks have been performed under the
17	process established under subsection (a).
18	(3) The number of employees and contractor
19	employees who hold credentials meeting the stand-
20	ards prescribed by Homeland Security Presidential
21	Directive 12 for whom Special Agreement Checks or
22	National Agency Checks with Inquiries have not
23	been completed.
24	(4) An assessment of the policies and practices
25	of the Department pertaining to suitability deter-

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minations and vetting of employees and contractors,
including an identification of situations in which an
employee or contractor employee may be permitted
unescorted access to facilities of the Veterans Health
Administration without undergoing a Special Agreement Check.

7 (d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

8 (1) The term "flash badge" means an identi9 fication document or proximity pass that does not
10 meet the standards prescribed by Homeland Security
11 Presidential Directive 12.

(2) The term "Special Agreement Check"
means a personnel screening process performed by
the Office of Personnel Management consisting of
fingerprinting and querying criminal databases.

16 (3) The term "National Agency Check with In17 quiries"—

18 (A) means a personnel screening process 19 performed by the Office of Personnel Manage-20 ment consisting of fingerprinting, querying a 21 greater number of criminal databases than re-22 quired under a Special Agreement Check, per-23 forming written inquiries of information pro-24 vided by the applicant, and querying credit bu-25 reau reporting; and

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1	(B) includes a Special Agreement Check.
2	(4) The term "covered contractor employee"
3	means a permanent or temporary employee of a con-
4	tractor or subcontractor of the Department of Vet-
5	erans Affairs who—
6	(A) has or will be permitted to have
7	unescorted access to facilities of the Veterans
8	Health Administration; or
9	(B) has or will be permitted to have reg-
10	ular or frequent interactions with veterans,
11	family members of veterans, or employees or
12	contractor employees of the Department in fa-
13	cilities of the Veterans Health Administration.
