Biography

The Department of Veterans Affairs, Veterans Health Administration (VHA) announced Mr. Troy M. Brown as the Senior Security Officer in November 2018. Prior to this position, Mr. Brown served as the Chief of Police for the VA Maryland Health Care System in Baltimore, Maryland, Special Agent for the Office of Security & Law Enforcement, and 15 years as a ranking VA police officer.

In his current VHA role, Mr. Brown oversees the management and direction of the Veteran Affairs nationwide 4500 man/women police force, designs and implements Infrastructure protection strategies protecting over \$100M in department assets, directs the nation-wide police program and is responsible for executing mitigation strategies to improve the overall safety and security of all VA medical centers and campuses.

As the VHA Senior Security Officer, Mr. Brown serves as the senior law enforcement advisor for the Department of Veterans Affairs, Veterans Health Administration (VHA), located at VA Central Office. Mr. Brown also operates as VHA's Interagency Law Enforcement liaison to the VA Office of Operations, Security and preparedness, VA Office of Security and Law Enforcement, and the VA integrated Operations Center (VAIOC) and other law enforcement partners.

Mr. Brown is the principal advisor to the Deputy Assistant Under Secretary for Health for Operations, Assistant Under Secretary for Health for Operations and the Executive in Charge for VHA, and other key officials within the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) on matters pertaining to VA's physical security, law enforcement training, and operations, and physical security.

Mr. Brown, who has extensive job-related training in anti-terrorism, drug task force, criminal intelligence, and military intelligence; has held positions as a special agent and intelligence officer for the VA Office of Security & Law Enforcement. A native of Baltimore, Maryland, Mr. Brown, earned numerous accommodations and awards during his years of service in the Marine Corps, including Marine Corps Achievement Medals, Commendation Medals and Good Conduct Medals. He also received the Bronze Federal Executive Board Award in 2001.
