1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

This Act may be cited as the "Manage VA Act".

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SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

1	SEC. 2. UNDER SECRETARY OF MANAGEMENT OF DEPART-
2	MENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS.
3	(a) In General.—Chapter 3 of title 38, United
4	States Code, is amended by inserting after section 307 the
5	following new section:
6	"§ 307A. Under Secretary for Management
7	"(a) In General.—There is in the Department an
8	Under Secretary for Management, who is appointed by the
9	President, by and with the advice and consent of the Sen-
10	ate. The Under Secretary for Management shall report di-
11	rectly to the Deputy Secretary.
12	"(b) RESPONSIBILITIES.—The Under Secretary for
13	Management shall serve as the Chief Management Officer
14	of the Department and principal advisor to the Secretary
15	on matters related to the management of the Department,
16	including management integration and transformation in
17	support of Veterans Affairs operations and programs. The
18	Secretary shall carry out the following responsibilities
19	through the Under Secretary for Management:
20	"(1) The budget, appropriations, expenditures
21	of funds, accounting, and finance.
22	"(2) Procurement, including infrastructure,
23	property, equipment, and other material resources.
24	"(3) Human resources and personnel.

1	"(4) Information technology, including policies
2	and directives to standardize information technology
3	systems across the components of the Department.
4	"(5) Strategic management planning and an-
5	nual performance planning and identification and
6	tracking of performance measures relating to the re-
7	sponsibilities of the Department.
8	"(6) The management integration and trans-
9	formation within each functional management dis-
10	cipline of the Department, including information
11	technology, financial management, acquisition man-
12	agement, and human capital management, to ensure
13	an efficient and orderly consolidation of functions
14	and personnel in the Department, including—
15	"(A) the development of centralized data
16	sources and connectivity of information sys-
17	tems, to the greatest extent practicable, to en-
18	hance program visibility, transparency, effec-
19	tiveness and coordination;
20	"(B) the development of standardized and
21	automated management information to manage
22	and oversee programs and make informed deci-
23	sions to improve the efficiency of the Depart-
24	ment;

1	"(C) the development of effective program
2	management and regular oversight mechanisms,
3	including clear roles and processes for program
4	governance, sharing of best practices, and ac-
5	cess to timely, reliable, and evaluated data on
6	all acquisitions and investments; and
7	"(D) the overall supervision, including the
8	conduct of internal audits and management
9	analyses, of the programs and activities of the
10	Department, including establishment of over-
11	sight procedures to ensure a full and effective
12	review of the efforts by components of the De-
13	partment to implement policies and procedures
14	of the Department for management integration
15	and transformation.
16	"(7) The development of a transition and suc-
17	cession plan, before December 1 of each year in
18	which a Presidential election is held, to guide the
19	transition of Department functions to a new Presi-
20	dential administration, and making such plan avail-
21	able to the next Secretary and Under Secretary for
22	Management and to the Committees on Veterans'
23	Affairs of the Senate and House of Representatives.
24	"(8) Reporting to the Government Account-
25	ability Office every six months to demonstrate meas-

1	urable, sustainable progress made in implementing
2	the corrective action plans of the Department to ad-
3	dress the designation of acquisition management on
4	the bi-annual high-risk list of the Government Ac-
5	countability Office, until the Comptroller General of
6	the United States submits to the appropriate con-
7	gressional committees written notification of removal
8	of the high-risk designation.
9	"(9) The management of the Office of Enter-
10	prise Integration.
11	"(10) The supervision of the Director of Con-
12	struction and Facilities, who shall report directly to
13	the Under Secretary for Management.
14	"(11) Any other management duties that the
15	Secretary may designate.".
16	(b) Clerical Amendment.—The table of sections
17	at the beginning of such chapter is amended by inserting
18	after the item relating to section 307 the following new
19	item:
	"307A. Under Secretary for Management.".
20	(c) Deadline for Appointment.—The Secretary
21	of Veterans Affairs shall appoint an individual to serve
22	as the Under Secretary of Veterans Affairs for Manage-
23	ment by not later than one year after the date of the en-

24 actment of this Act.
