A BILL

To require the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to require the employees of the Department of Veterans Affairs to receive training developed by the Inspector General of the Department on reporting wrongdoing to, responding to requests from, and cooperating with the Office of Inspector General of the Department, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Department of Vet-
3 erans Affairs Office of Inspector General Training Act of
4 2023”.

5 **SEC. 2. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS EMPLOYEE**
6 **TRAINING REGARDING OFFICE OF INSPEC-**
7 **TOR GENERAL.**

8 (a) TRAINING.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs
9 shall require each employee of the Department of Veterans
10 Affairs who begins employment with the Department on
11 or after the date of the enactment of this Act to receive
12 training that the Inspector General of the Department
13 shall develop on the reporting of wrongdoing to, respond-
14 ing to requests from, and cooperating with the Office of
15 Inspector General of the Department.

16 (b) TIMING OF TRAINING.—In carrying out sub-
17 section (a), the Secretary shall require each employee of
18 the Department covered under such subsection to undergo
19 the training required by such subsection not later than
20 one year after the date on which the employee begins em-
21 ployment with the Department.

22 (c) ELEMENTS.—Training developed and required
23 under subsection (a) shall include the following:

24 (1) Definition of the role, responsibilities, and
25 legal authority of the Inspector General of the De-
26 partment and the duties of employees of the Depart-

1 ment for engaging with the Office of Inspector Gen-
2 eral.

3 (2) Identification of the circumstances and
4 mechanisms for reporting fraud, waste, abuse, and
5 other wrongdoing to the Inspector General, including
6 making confidential complaints to the Inspector
7 General.

8 (3) Identification of the prohibitions and rem-
9 edies that help to protect employees of the Depart-
10 ment from retaliation when reporting wrongdoing to
11 the Inspector General.

12 (4) Recognition of opportunities to engage with
13 staff of the Office of Inspector General to improve
14 programs, operations, and services of the Depart-
15 ment.

16 (d) DESIGN AND UPDATE.—The Inspector General of
17 the Department shall design, and update as the Inspector
18 General considers appropriate, the training developed and
19 required by subsection (a).

20 (e) SYSTEM.—The Secretary shall provide, via the
21 talent management system of the Department, or suc-
22 cessor system, the training developed and required under
23 subsection (a).

24 (f) RELATION TO CERTAIN TRAINING.—The Sec-
25 retary shall ensure that training developed and required

1 under subsection (a) is separate and distinct from training
2 provided under section 733 of title 38, United States
3 Code.

4 (g) NOTICE TO EMPLOYEES.—The Secretary shall
5 ensure that the Inspector General is afforded the oppor-
6 tunity, not less frequently than twice each year and more
7 frequently if the Inspector General considers appropriate
8 under extraordinary circumstances, to use the electronic
9 mail system of the Department to notify all authorized
10 users of such system of the following:

11 (1) The roles and responsibilities of the employ-
12 ees of the Department when engaging with the Of-
13 fice of Inspector General.

14 (2) The availability of training provided under
15 subsection (a).

16 (3) How to access training provided under sub-
17 section (a).

18 (4) Information about how to contact the Office
19 of Inspector General, including a link to any
20 website-based reporting form of the Office.

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
