David Case started as the Deputy Inspector General of the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) on April 2, 2018. As Deputy Inspector General, he works to accomplish the mission of the Office of Inspector General (OIG) by directing and working with the OIG's nationwide staff of auditors, investigators, inspectors, and support personnel.



Prior to joining the VA OIG, Mr. Case was a partner at the law firm of K&L Gates. He joined K&L Gates in 1984 and served from 2008 to 2018 as the managing partner of the Washington, DC, office and as a member of K&L Gates' Management Committee. While at K&L Gates, Mr. Case focused on trial work and litigation in financial services, insurance coverage, government contracts, and toxic tort. Before joining K&L Gates, Mr. Case was a judge advocate in the United States Marine Corps and served as a law clerk to the Honorable R. James Harvey, United States District Judge for the Eastern District of Michigan.
