Greg Nembhard is the Deputy Director for Claims Services in the National Veteran Affairs & Rehabilitation (VA&R) Division of the Washington DC office. Greg is responsible overseeing the operations of the VA&R Board of Veterans Appeals (BVA) units located in Washington DC and Indianapolis, Indiana. In this position he serves as liaison with Veterans Affairs Central Office, VA BVA and other Federal Agencies and provides the Director with technical information related to the VA Claims and Pension system. Greg also prepares information for

legislative mandates and monitors American Legion mandates presented to Congress, investigates and tracks issues important to The American Legion's position regarding Claims and Pension, and conducts and oversees research that assist in the development of legislation and policy on veteran's Claims and Pension.

Greg is a Veteran of both the United State Marine Corps and Army (Reserves) with a combined 15 years of active and reserve service. He served two tours of duty as an active duty Marine, with 2 deployments to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) I and II.
