improve the VA's workload management, human capital utilization and financial stewardship to efficiently deliver outstanding results for approximately 5 million disability, pension, and benefits adjustments processed annually, delivering more than \$149 billion in benefits to 6.3 million Veterans and survivors. Prior to his current assignment, Kenneth served as the Deputy Director for Operations Analysis, where he was responsible for establishing regional office performance targets, staffing, and quantitative analyses supporting claims processing improvements.
