2 This Act may be cited as the "Review Every Veterans3 Claim Act of 2025".

4 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON DENIAL OF CLAIMS FOR BENE5 FITS UNDER LAWS ADMINISTERED BY SEC6 RETARY OF VETERANS AFFAIRS ON SOLE
7 BASIS THAT VETERAN FAILED TO APPEAR
8 FOR CERTAIN MEDICAL EXAMINATION.

(2) in paragraph (2), by striking "treat an examination or opinion as being necessary to make a
decision on a claim for purposes of" and inserting
"provide for a medical examination or obtain a medical opinion under"; and

18 (3) by adding at the end the following new19 paragraph:

20 "(3) If a veteran fails to appear for a medical exam-21 ination provided by the Secretary in conjunction with a 22 claim for a benefit under a law administered by the Sec-23 retary, the Secretary may not deny such claim on the sole 24 basis that such veteran failed to appear for such medical 25 examination.".
