This migration required the JFMS system to process both U.S. and foreign currencies and integrate with the DOS global supply chain solution. Ultimately JFMS successfully migrated all global users from mainframe-based financial management solutions to the existing Momentum platform.

Earlier in his career, Mr. Getz served as the integration manager for the JFMS program at the DOS and implemented procurement solutions at both DOS and USAID. He was also the project manager for several state and local ERP implementations and supported design and development of CGI’s Government Human Resource Service (“GHR”) payroll solution, used by various state and local governments.

Mr. Getz currently serves as a member of the American Council for Technology and Industry Advisory Council (“ACT-IAC”) VA Federal Insights Exchange committee, and has served on the board of two non-profit organizations.
