Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Fighting Fraud to Pro-3 tect Care for Seniors Act of 2018".

4 SEC. 2. MEDICARE SMART CARD PILOT PROGRAM.

5 Part E of title XVIII of the Social Security Act is
6 amended by inserting after section 1866E the following
7 new section:

8 "SEC. 1866F. SMART CARD PILOT PROGRAM.

9 "(a) IMPLEMENTATION.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 36 months
after the date of the enactment of this section, the
Secretary shall establish a pilot program (in this section referred to as the 'pilot program') to evaluate
the feasibility of using smart card technology under
this title.

16 "(2) SMART CARD TECHNOLOGY DEFINED.—In
17 this section, the term 'smart card technology' means
18 the following:

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1 "(A) BENEFICIARY SMART CARD.—A ma-2 chine readable, tamper-resistant card (in this section referred to as a 'smart card') that in-3 4 cludes an embedded integrated circuit chip with a secure micro-controller (as defined by the Na-5 6 tional Institute on Standards and Technology) 7 that enables the verification and secure, elec-8 tronic authentication of the identity of a Medi-9 care beneficiary at the point of service through 10 a combination of the smart card and a personal 11 identification number known by or associated 12 with such beneficiary.

13 "(B) CARD READER TECHNOLOGY.—Infor-14 mation technology that enables a supplier and 15 provider to authenticate the identity of a Medi-16 care beneficiary through presentation of such a 17 smart card and such components, with such au-18 thentication to be reflected through the use of 19 a modifier or in another appropriate manner, as 20 determined by the Secretary, in the claims ad-21 judication process.

22 "(3) PROGRAM DESIGN ELEMENTS.—The pilot
23 program shall be conducted for a period of 3 years
24 consistent with the following:

1 "(A) SELECTION OF AREA.—In consulta-2 tion with the Inspector General of the Depart-3 ment of Health and Human Services, the Sec-4 retary shall select at least 3 geographic areas in 5 which the pilot program will operate. 6 "(B) SELECTION OF SUPPLIER AND PRO-7 VIDER TYPES.—In consultation with the Inspec-8 tor General of the Department of Health and 9 Human Services, the Secretary shall select sup-10 plier and provider types that will be required to 11 participate in the pilot program (referred to in 12 this section as 'participating suppliers and pro-13 viders'). In selecting such supplier and provider 14 types, the Secretary shall— "(i) take into account the risk of 15 16 fraud, waste, and abuse (as described in 17 section 1866(j)(2)(B) with respect to the 18 category of provider or supplier) and other 19 factors as determined appropriate by the 20 Secretary; and 21 "(ii) limit the pilot program to no 22 more than 2,000 suppliers and providers. 23 "(C) SUPPLIER AND PROVIDER HARDSHIP

1	from participation in the pilot program a sup-
2	plier or provider that either—
3	"(i) does not have access to card read-
4	er technology (as described in paragraph

6	"(ii) does not have sufficient internet

8	"(iii) has a low volume (as determined

11	"(D) Smart card and smart card
12	READER ISSUANCE.—
13	"(i) BENEFICIARY SMART CARD
14	ISSUANCE.—The Secretary shall provide
15	for, at no cost, the issuance (and, if nec-
16	essary, replacement) of beneficiary smart
17	cards described in paragraph $(2)(A)$ to all
18	Medicare beneficiaries residing in a geo-
19	graphic area in which the pilot program is
20	conducted under subparagraph (A). Infor-
21	mation that appears on Medicare cards
22	used outside the pilot program may appear
23	on the face of the beneficiary smart card.
24	"(ii) Supplier and provider smart
25	CARD READER ISSUANCE.—At the request

1	of a participating supplier or provider, the
2	Secretary shall provide for, at no cost, the
3	issuance to such supplier or provider of
4	smart card hardware and software nec-
5	essary to participate in the pilot program.
6	"(E) INFORMATION ON OPERATION OF
7	PILOT PROGRAM.—The Secretary shall provide
8	participating suppliers and providers and Medi-
9	care beneficiaries who are furnished items and
10	services by such suppliers and providers, with
11	information on the operation of the pilot pro-
12	gram, including privacy protections described in
13	subparagraph (I).
14	"(F) Access to services outside the
15	PILOT PROGRAM.—
16	"(i) Beneficiaries.—Medicare bene-
17	ficiaries who receive beneficiary smart
18	cards may receive items and services from
19	suppliers and providers not participating in
20	the pilot program.
21	"(ii) SUPPLIERS AND PROVIDER
22	CLAIMS.—
23	"(I) SUPPLIERS AND PROVIDERS
24	NOT PARTICIPATING IN PILOT.—Sup-
25	pliers and providers not participating

1	in the pilot program may submit
2	claims under this title for items and
3	services furnished without use of
4	smart card technology to Medicare
5	beneficiaries who receive beneficiary
6	smart cards.
7	"(II) PARTICIPATING SUPPLIERS
8	AND PROVIDERS FURNISHING SERV-
9	ICES TO NON-PARTICIPATING BENE-
10	FICIARIES.—Supplier and providers
11	participating in the pilot program may
12	submit claims under this title for
13	items and services furnished to Medi-
14	care beneficiaries who do not receive
15	beneficiary smart cards.
16	"(G) CLARIFICATION ON ACCESS TO SERV-
17	ICES WITHOUT SMART CARDS.—In the case of a
18	Medicare beneficiary who receives a beneficiary
19	smart card and does not present such card at
20	the time of receipt of items or services from a
21	participating supplier or provider, the partici-
22	pating supplier or provider—
23	"(i) shall furnish such items or serv-
24	ices to such Medicare beneficiary as if such
25	beneficiary does present such card;

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1	"(ii) may submit claims under this
2	title for such items or services; and
3	"(iii) shall provide, in accordance with
4	such manner, process, and timing as speci-
5	fied by the Secretary, information to the
6	Secretary (through the contractor de-
7	scribed in subparagraph (H)) that such
8	beneficiary received such a smart card but
9	did not have the smart card at the time
10	the items or services were furnished.
11	"(H) PRIVATE SECTOR IMPLEMENTA-
12	TION.—The Secretary shall select, by using a
13	competitive procurement process in accordance
14	with the provisions of chapter 1 of title 48,
15	Code of Federal Regulations (or any successor
16	regulations), a private sector contractor to im-
17	plement and operate the pilot program.
18	"(I) PRIVACY PROTECTIONS.—The Sec-
19	retary shall ensure that the pilot program com-
20	plies with applicable Federal laws and regula-
21	tions concerning individually identifiable health
22	information, including the Privacy Act of 1974
23	and regulations promulgated under section
24	264(c) of the Health Insurance Portability and
25	Accountability Act of 1996 and such individ-

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ually identifiable information shall be exempt 2 from disclosure under section 552(b)(3) of title 3 5, United States Code.

"(J) MANDATORY PARTICIPATION.—Sub-4 5 ject to subparagraph (C), in the case of items 6 or services furnished by a provider or supplier 7 included in a supplier or provider type selected 8 under subparagraph (B) in a geographic area 9 selected under subparagraph (A), payment may 10 only be made under this title for such items or 11 services during the period of the pilot program 12 if the provider or supplier is participating in the 13 pilot program.

14 "(K) PROHIBITION OF SMART CARD 15 FEES.—No transaction, utilization, or other fees may be imposed on Medicare beneficiaries 16 17 or participating suppliers and providers with re-18 spect to the use of smart cards under the pilot 19 program.

20 "(4) STAKEHOLDER INPUT.—

21 "(A) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 6 22 months after the date of the enactment of this 23 section, the Secretary shall convene a panel 24 consisting of stakeholders (including representa-25 tives of providers, suppliers, technology vendors,

12	"(A) An evaluation of the effect of the
13	pilot program on potential fraud under the in-
14	surance programs established under this title.
15	"(B) A description of any barriers to im-
16	plementation of the pilot program.
17	"(C) Participant feedback on the pilot pro-
18	gram.
19	"(D) Recommendations regarding the fu-
20	ture use of smart cards to address fraud under
21	this title.
22	"(E) Data on the information provided
23	under subsection (a)(3)(G)(iii).".

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
