8	ment may be made under this part with respect to
9	an individual, with respect to hearing aids furnished
10	on or after January 1, 2022—
11	"(A) not more than once during any 5-year
12	period;
13	"(B) only for types of such hearing aids
14	that are not over-the-counter hearing aids (as
15	defined in section $520(q)(1)$ of the Federal
16	Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act) and that are
17	determined appropriate by the Secretary; and
18	"(C) only if furnished pursuant to a writ-
19	ten order of a physician or qualified audiologist
20	(as described in section 1861(ll)(4)(B)).".
